

# Your Support Helps Kids and Families in the Bay Area

Many of the families we serve struggle daily with severe mental and behavioral health challenges, food and housing instability, untreated trauma and abuse, and lack of family or community support. For many, Pacific Clinics is their only hope left.

Last year, Pacific Clinics helped more than 8,000 children and their parents across Santa Clara County. 71% of the children we served saw a significant and measurable reduction in depression, anxiety, and suicidality because of our programs. However, to continue to meet this ever-increasing need, we rely on fundraising events to fill the funding gap. This year's event will raise critical funding for:

- \* Neuro-developmental Services for children with autism spectrum disorder and other neurodiverse challenges, and their parents.
- \* The Hope Drop-In Center for transition-age youth including peer support groups, mental health services, shower and laundry facilities, food, housing assistance, and academic and work opportunities.
- \* Professional Parent Program for intensive high needs foster youth who have never experienced a stable home.
- \* The We Care Fund for essential support including food, blankets, clothing, rental assistance, diapers, and school and hygiene supplies.
- \* Crisis intervention services for children at risk of harming themselves or others.
- \* Celebrating Families for families overcoming drug and alcohol addiction.



# Healing Through Hard Work & Love

Marisa is a 14 year old foster child who has lived through abuse, homelessness, isolation and mental health struggles.

She was taken away from her mother at the age of 4 and adopted by an aunt and uncle with whom she clashed constantly. During this time, Marisa felt isolated and alone without friends or accepting family. Marisa rebelled and struggled to talk about her thoughts which increasingly ran towards self harm and cutting. At the age of 8, Marisa was placed in foster care, and over the next 5 years, bounced between seven different foster homes. She was also diagnosed as bi-polar and with ADHD.

When she was referred to Pacific Clinics, she was running away to couch surf, experiment with drugs and alcohol, and sleep on the streets on a regular basis. Quickly, Marisa's Pacific Clinics team got to work to stabilize her and refer her to our Professional Parent program for intensive high needs youth. Paired with an experienced, trained, and loving resource parent, Marisa experienced a stable home environment for the first time. Additionally, new shoes, clothes, and school supplies were provided by the We Care Fund.

In therapy, Marisa began to open up about an assault that happened when she was on the streets. She was also reconnected with family in the area she had lost touch with. Through a stable home environment, therapy, and loving family members, she began to thrive. She has hopes for her future, and knows she is not alone, and that healing can be achieved with hard work and love.
